Bachelor of Arts Major and Minor in Physical Education

Degree details

1. Physical Education Diploma

Students must complete 60 semester credit hours of course work with a minimum Grade Point Average of 3 to be eligible for the diploma. Students who have been awarded advanced credit standing must complete a minimum of 30 semester credit hours at VIU, with a Grade Point Average of 3. Students should be aware that admission to the diploma program does not guarantee registration in all the required courses. Please contact the Sport, Health, and Physical Education Department for more information.

A free information session for prospective students is usually held in early spring. Check with the Advising Centre for more details, 250-740-6410, or visit viu.ca/infosessions.

Career Opportunities

Graduates of VIU's Diploma program have found employment in spas, aerobics centres, summer camps, parks, fitness centres, swimming pools, and squash and racquetball clubs. The field has a broad spectrum, and opportunities for employment increase greatly for individuals who possess a university P.E. degree.

Admission Requirements

- General admission requirements apply.
- English 12 with minimum "C" grade, or equivalent.

Start Date and Application Deadline

The program starts in September, and applications are accepted after November 15. *Late Application Date--March 31:* applications received after this date will be considered "late"; a later registration date will be assigned, which may mean that course selection is limited.

2. University Transfer

1 or 2 years

The Program

VIU's Physical Education University Transfer program provides years one and two of study towards a degree that can be completed at the University of British Columbia, University of Victoria, or Simon Fraser University.

Admission Requirements

- General admission requirements apply.
- English 12 with minimum "C" grade, or equivalent.

Start Date and Application Deadline

Students can start the program in September or January; however, the selection of courses is usually greater in the Fall semester. Applications for September classes are accepted after November 15.

Late Application Date--March 31: applications received after this date will be considered "late"; a later registration date will be assigned, which may mean that course selection is limited.

Fees

Tuition fees for this program are calculated using Fee Category V. Students are also assessed a Students' Union fee and a Student Activity fee. Full-time students at Nanaimo campus are assessed a Health & Dental Plan fee. To see how fees are calculated, clickhere.

3. UBC Transfer

Bachelor of Human Kinetics

Three streams of study are available at UBC: Kinesiology and Health Science, Human Kinetics Interdisciplinary Studies, and Physical and Health Education. While not all required first and second-year courses are offered at Vancouver Island University, students can usually complete year one.

* Students going into teaching will select electives to fulfill a second teaching area (consult a UBC calendar). Students planning on entering the 12-month Secondary Education program at UBC must complete the four-year Bachelor of Human Kinetics first.

It is strongly recommended that students planning to transfer consult the UBC Calendar Part II Undergraduate Admission, Specific Program Requirements for Application from a Secondary School in BC/Yukon.

4. UVic Transfer

Bachelor of Education-Secondary (P.E. Major)

Transfer and admission to UVic Bachelor of Education Secondary (PE Major) requires approval of the School of Exercise Science, Physical and Health Education; this program is restricted by

quotas, and not all qualified applicants will necessarily be admitted.

Students can normally complete the first two years of the degree at Vancouver Island University and can transfer to UVic with Physical Education analysis and theory deficiencies. Missing program requirements can be met once the student is accepted into UVic's School of Exercise Science, Physical and Health Education program, and necessary courses are completed.

The Bachelor of Education (Secondary) program indicates that the graduate is prepared to teach two high school subjects and has successfully completed two appropriate Majors.

Notes:

- All P.E. students should see an Education Advisor prior to the selection of courses.
- VIU 3 credits equals UVic 1.5 units.
